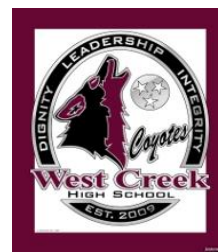

By appointment only. Students must sign up for tutoring before school or during class. They **may not** sign up for tutoring at the end of the day, for the same day. I am always happy to work with students when they need assistance, **but students need to be proactive so that they can get help when they need it.**

Make – up Work/late work:

Absent work is located in the missing work crate in the classroom. Students are responsible for picking up the assignments. They will receive the amount of days they were absent to complete the work. Students will be expected to copy any notes that they have missed from a classmate or from my notebook. A zero will be entered for all assignments until it is turned in.

No late assignments will be accepted. All tests and quizzes must be made-up within 1 week. If students miss this window they will be given a zero. Students are responsible to contact their teacher to set up their make-up quiz or test.

CLASSROOM NORMS FOR TECHNOLOGY

Students will immediately log on to the computer and await further instructions given by the teacher. Students will listen for teacher's cue to close screen of laptop when whole-group attention is needed. Students will save/turn in work as needed and completely shut down computers when directed to do so. Students will visit only the websites listed in the activity or stated by the teacher. Any accidental deviation to an unauthorized website should be reported to the teacher immediately. Students will remain seated at all times while using computers. Students will not eat or drink in the classroom at any time (especially when devices are being used).
